Explorers Grove Imagination Inspired

Imagine a place...

...where kids can hang out with their grown-ups, daydream or read beside woodland creatures.

Imagine a place that inspires your child's curiosity about the world around them and encourages their creativity.

Imagine a place where children can eagerly come to play and pretend.

Introducing, Explorers Grove at the Oshkosh Public Library.

Conceived as a one-of-a-kind learning space intended for our community's children and families to connect to ideas and each other through play, Explorers Grove is officially open for adventure on Sat., Jan. 26.

"It's been four years in the making," said Marie Boleman, Head of Children's & Family Outreach Services. "After the intricate planning, design and construction phases, we're thrilled to be celebrating a space dedicated to promoting curiosity, learning, self-expression and discovery."

"Research tells us that beginning at birth, children develop literacy and lifelong learning skills when they talk, sing, read, write and play; and Explorers Grove is a space that encourages all these things."

The cozy circle of tall tree-like structures, a large animal mural on the wall and a discovery station foster free play and interactive learning experiences. The setting welcomes caregivers and parents to be fully present in the moment with their children.

Explorers Grove and an additional LEGO wall located in the library's Technology Lab were made possible through a memorial donation honoring longtime librarian Nancy Jackisch.

"Nancy worked for Oshkosh Public Library for 43 years, serving as a children's librarian during much of that time, so it's especially fitting for Explorers Grove to be associated with her legacy and love for learning," said Boleman.

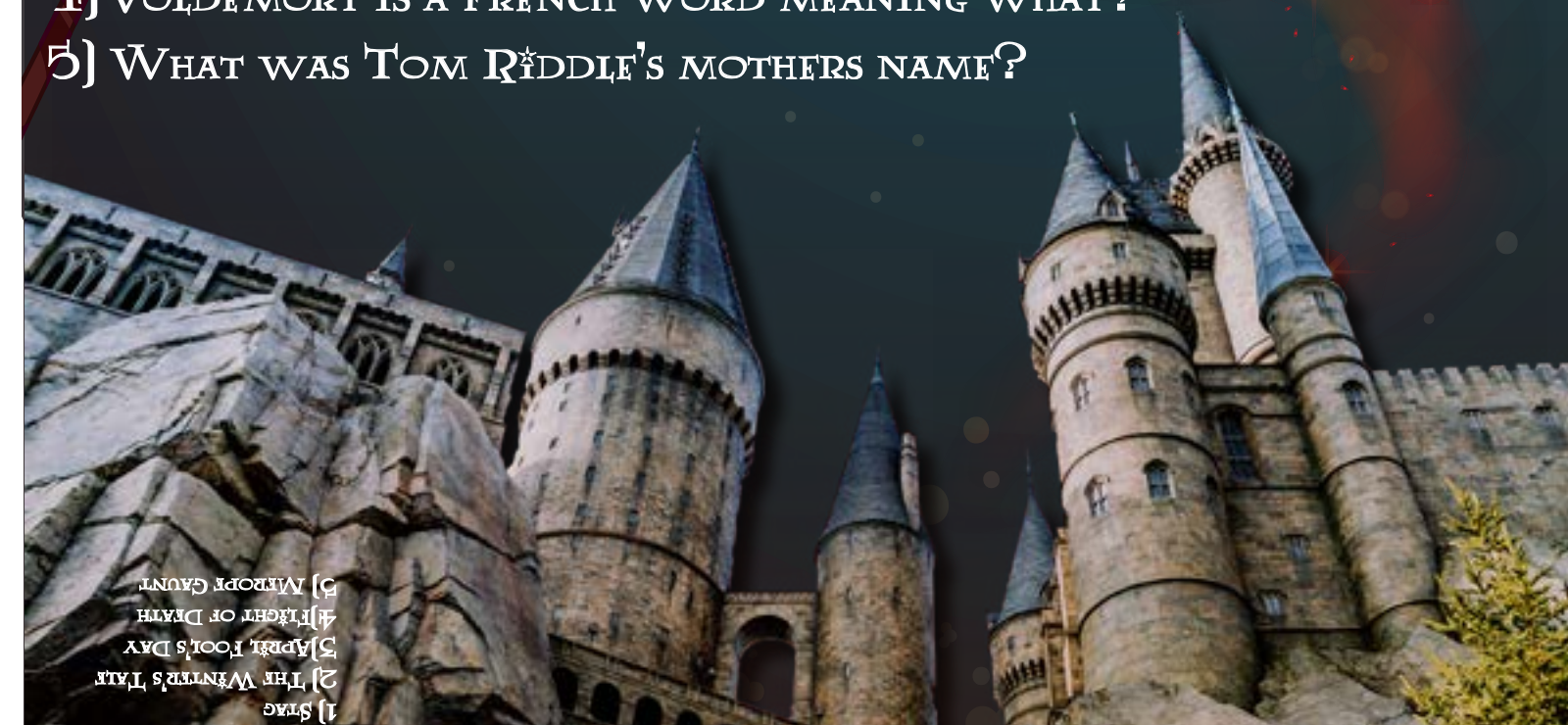

Tender apples are tucked beneath a sweet granola topping in this classic crisp. For variety, replace the apples with your favorite fruit. – Barbara Schindler, Napoleon, Ohio
 Prep: 20 min
 Cook: 5 hours
 Makes: 6-8 servings

8 medium tart apples, peeled and sliced
 ¼ cup lemon juice
 1 ½ teaspoons grated lemon peel
 2 ½ cups granola with fruit and nuts
 1 cup sugar
 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
 ½ cup butter, melted

1. In a large bowl, toss the apples, lemon juice and peel. Transfer to a greased 3-qt slow cooker. Combine the granola, sugar and cinnamon; sprinkle over apples. Drizzle with butter.
2. Cover and cook on low for 5-6 hours or until the apples are tender. Serve warm.
